Greater Depth Order given words correctly to create a sentence with two adjectives. Includes one unsuitable adjective not needed in the sentence. Includes words mostly taken from the Y2 word list with some words taken from Y3 word lists.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain the mistake made when using an adjective in a noun phrase. Includes words taken from the Y1 word list.

Expected Explain the mistake made when using an adjective in a sentence. Includes words taken from the Y1/2 word lists.

Greater Depth Explain the mistake made when using two adjectives in a sentence. Includes words mostly taken from the Y2 word list with some words taken from Y3 word lists.






